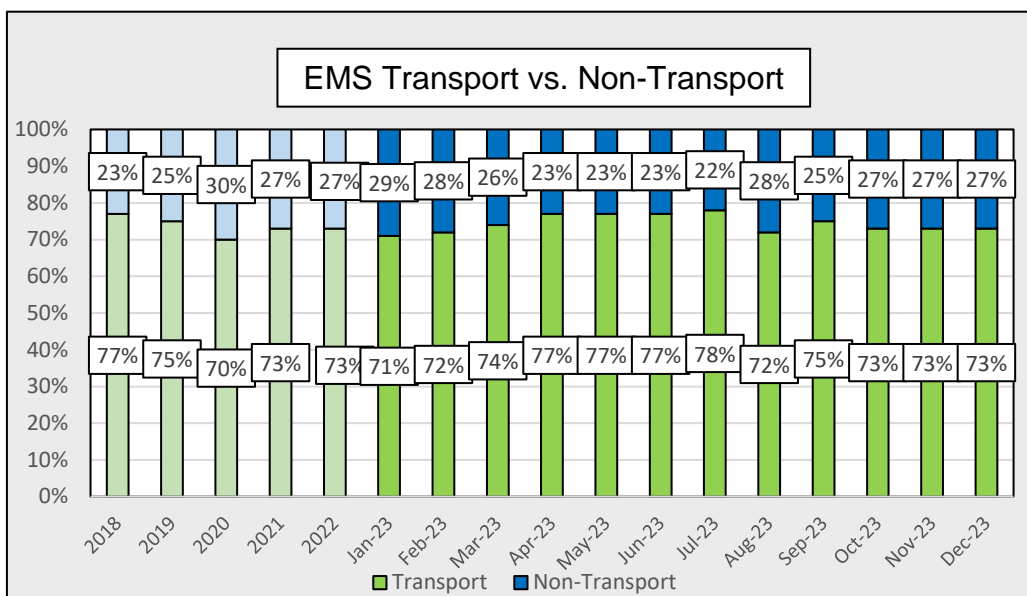
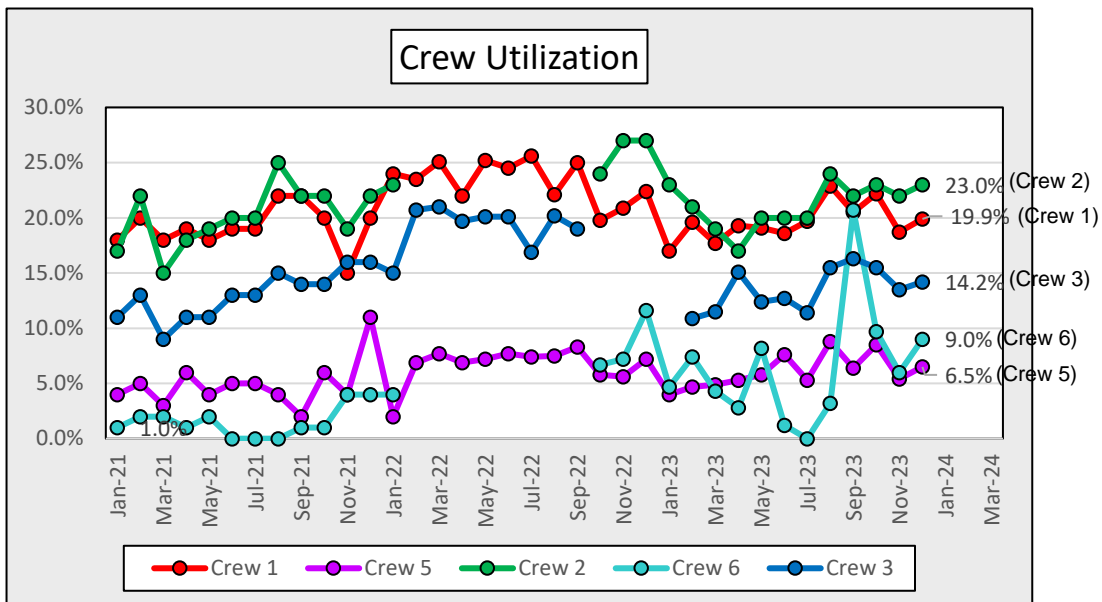
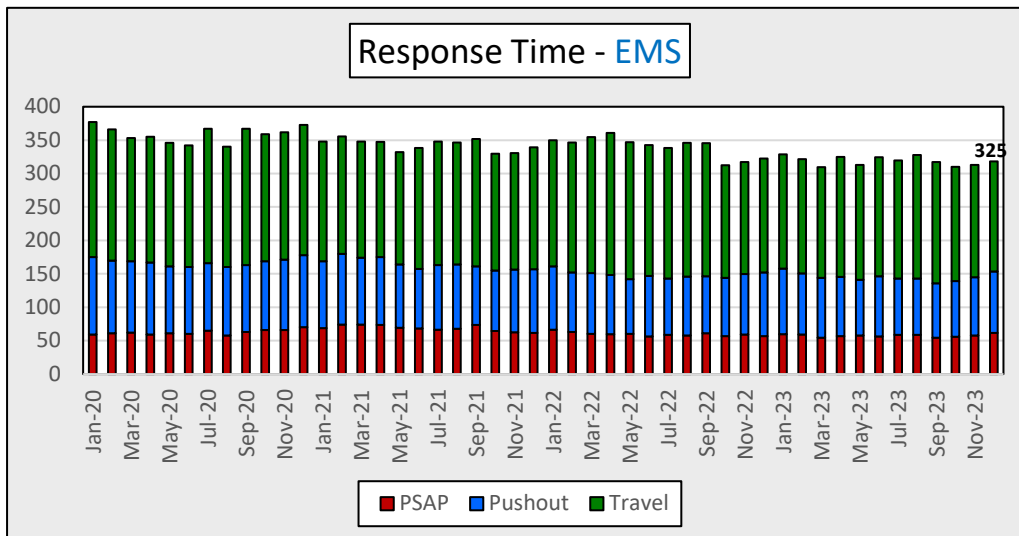
Emergency Responses by Type:

Significant Incidents:

Round Lake Crews were dispatched to 18 structure fires in December. Of these, 4 were in-district and 2 were significant:

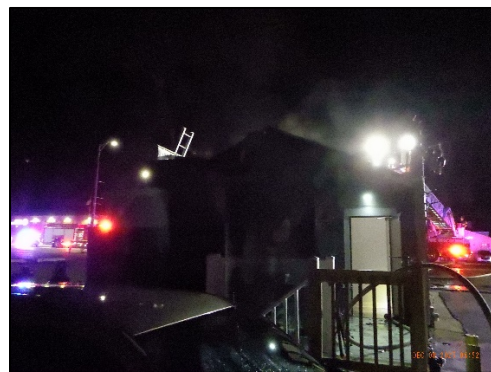
December 8, 2023 at 04:24 hours:

Crews were dispatched for a report of a structure fire in the 1600 block of Cedar Lake Road in Round Lake Beach. Engine 262 arrived first and reported smoke and flames showing from the rear of a small commercial building used as a used car dealership. They established initial command, set up a water supply and advanced an attack line to the rear of the structure for fire attack. Engine 262R arrived shortly after, assisted with setting up water supply and extended a second attack line to the rear of the building.

Battalion 26 arrived and assumed command of the incident. A working still alarm was requested to bring in mutual aid resources to cover the remainder of the Fire District. The fire was declared under control within 20 minutes of the initial dispatch. A room addition on the rear of the structure was destroyed by fire, but the fire was stopped before extending into the main building itself.

There were no injuries to civilians or firefighters.

Round Lake units were assisted at the scene by resources from Fox Lake, Grayslake and Wauconda and units from Antioch and McHenry provided station coverage.



December 11, 2023 at 05:41 hours:

Crews were dispatched for a report of a structure fire in the 900 block of Lunga Drive in Round Lake. Battalion 26 arrived first and reported smoke showing on the exterior side of a single-story mobile home. Battalion 26 assumed command and performed a size up of the fire, which appeared to have started in a garbage can located next to the structure and extended up the exterior siding. Engine 261 arrived next and extended an attack line to the side of the structure to perform overhaul and salvage operations. The remainder of incoming fire units staged or were diverted to cover the remainder of the Fire District.

One civilian was treated at the scene for smoke inhalation. There were no injuries to firefighters.
