


















Significant Incidents:

Round Lake Crews were dispatched to 16 structure fires in April. Of these, 4 were in-district and one was significant.

Wednesday, April 19th @ 11:04 am (Red):

Crews were dispatched to the 300 block of E. Lake Shore Drive in Round Lake Park for a report of a house on fire. Battalion 26 arrived on scene within 4 minutes and reported a working fire with smoke and flames showing on the exterior Bravo side and both the first and second floor windows of a two-story single-family home. Engine 261 arrived with B26, advanced an attack line to the Bravo side and began to apply water from the exterior to darken down the flames. Ladder Tower 261 arrived next and their crew pulled a second hose line to the Charlie-Delta corner and began applying water to flames coming from the 2nd floor eves. Shortly after arrival, there was a partial roof collapse and operations were transitioned to a defensive only fire attack. The ladder tower was set up in the front of the building and used its master stream to apply water through the collapsed roof from above while crews continued to apply water from exterior hand lines at the Bravo and Charley-Delta sides.

The fire was brought under control in approximately 45 minutes with most of the home being a complete loss. There were no injuries to civilians or firefighters.

Our crews were assisted by crews from Fox Lake, Grayslake, Lake Villa, and Wauconda at the scene. During the fire, calls in the remainder of the Fire District were covered by Antioch and McHenry.
